





RESOLUTION NO. 2018-05

WHEREAS, the Captiva Erosion Prevention District ("District") is authorized by Chapter 2000-399, Laws of Florida as a beach and shore preservation district; and

WHEREAS, The District has developed and adopted a comprehensive beach and shore preservation program and a beach maintenance program for the area within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, The District has partnered with the federal, state, and County governments to accomplish its successful beach programs; and

WHEREAS, The District has implemented the Captiva Beach Restoration Project, which was authorized pursuant to Resolution 87-5 and the vote of the Captiva electors in 1987, and intends that the Restoration Project be maintained; and

WHEREAS, The District has maintained the Captiva Beach Restoration Project with successive renourishment projects in 1988, 1996, 2005, 2008, and 2013; and

WHEREAS, The District is authorized under section 10, Chapter 2000-399, Laws of Florida, to provide for the construction, reconstruction or maintenance of an Erosion Prevention Project or Projects and for the levying of special assessments upon benefited property, upon obtaining the approval from a majority of the qualified electors residing in the District voting in a referendum election to be called by the District Board.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CAPTIVA EROSION PREVENTION DISTRICT OF LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA that:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners of the Captiva Erosion Prevention District does hereby authorize and order the construction of the following erosion prevention project ("Project"), under and subject to the provisions of Section 10, Chapter 2000-399, Laws of Florida, which Project shall consist of maintenance renourishment of the Captiva Beach Restoration Project by the placement of fill thereon from the northern end beginning at Redfish Pass extending south to the southern end at Blind Pass.

Section 2. The erosion prevention project shall be given the designation "The Captiva Island 2020-2021 Beach Maintenance Renourishment Project", and may be referred to feet. in all proceedings and assessments, with the exception of certain Notices by Publication, according to the provisions of Chapter 2000-399, Laws of Florida.

Section 3. The Captiva Island 2020-2021 Beach Maintenance Renourishment Project is more fully described as placement of fill thereon from the northern end beginning at Redfish Pass extending south to Blind Pass, between FDEP survey monuments R-84 and R-109, with a fill volume of approximately 900,000 cubic yards over 25,600 feet of Gulf shoreline and an average added beach width of 90 feet.

Section 4. The Project shall be paid for in part or in whole through the levy of special assessments against benefited properties within the District.

Section 5. Construction on the Project shall commence, and special assessments shall be authorized, only with the approval of a majority of qualified electors residing in the District voting in the referendum election to be called by the District Board in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 2000-399, Laws of Florida.

Rep. Omar apologizes for tweets called anti-Semitic

WASHINGTON — Freshman Democratic Rep. Ilhan Omar apologized Monday for tweets suggesting that members of Congress support Israel because they are being paid to do so, which drew bipartisan criticism and a rebuke from House Speaker Nancy Pelosi.

The Minnesota Democrat said she had no intention of offending anyone, including Jewish Americans.

"We have to always be willing to step back and think through criticism, just as I expect people to hear me when others attack me about my identity," Omar tweeted, "This is why I unequivocally apologize."

The statement was the latest reckoning among Democrats of intense differences in their ranks over the U.S.-Israeli relationship, highlighted by criticism from Omar and Rep. Rashida Tlaib of Michigan. They are the first Muslim women to serve in Congress. Pelosi and

other Democrats, including leaders and chairmen, laid down a marker making clear that Omar had overstepped.

In a pair of tweets over the weekend, Omar criticized the American Israel Public Affairs Committee, or AIPAC. "It's all about the Benjamin's baby," she wrote, invoking slang about \$100 bills.

Asked on Twitter who she thought was paying members of Congress to support Israel, Omar responded, "AIPAC!"

That sparked Pelosi's first public rebuke of a freshman lawmaker who had helped flip the House from Republican control and is part of a record number of women in Congress.

"Congresswoman Omar's use of anti-Semitic tropes and prejudicial accusations about Israel's supporters is deeply offensive," Pelosi said in a statement issued by her office and signed by other Democratic leaders after a bipartisan backlash. "We condemn these remarks, and we call upon Congresswoman Omar to immediately apologize for these hurt-

ful comments." Omar's fellow freshmen felt the strain. Some, such as Jewish Reps. Elaine Luria of Virginia and Max Rose of New York, explicitly denounced her remarks. But Rep. Deb Haaland, D-N.M., refused to condemn them, saying they referred to money in politics and "not anything else."

The statement was the latest reckoning among Democrats of intense differences in their ranks over the U.S.-Israeli relationship.

AIPAC is a nonprofit organization that works to influence U.S. policy toward Israel. It encourages its more than 100,000 members to do so and to be politically active.

The nonprofit responded Sunday night: "We are proud that we are engaged in the democratic process to strengthen the US-Israel relationship.

Our bipartisan efforts are reflective of American values and interests. We will not be deterred in any way by ill-informed and illegitimate attacks on this important work."

Omar supports a movement known as BDS, for "boycott, divestment and sanctions" aimed at Israel. And it's not the first time she's fought accusations of anti-Semitism. She insists her rejection of the Israeli government refers to its stance toward Palestinians and is not directed at Jewish people.

Omar has expressed regret for tweeting in 2012: "Israel has hypnotized the world, may Allah awaken the people and help them see the evil doings of Israel." She said the statement came in the context of Israel's treatment of Palestinians in the Gaza Strip.

"It's now apparent to me that I spent lots of energy putting my 2012 tweet in context and little energy in disavowing the anti-Semitic trope I unknowingly used, which is unfortunate and offensive," she tweeted last month.



LLC, a managed-care plan affiliated with the Lee Health system, also ordered that AHCA notify any Medicaid beneficiaries assigned to receive care from Molina under the contract that they will be reassigned to other health plans.

Attorneys for the agency quickly filed a notice of appeal at the Tallahassee-based 1st District Court of Appeal. The notice had the effect of placing an automatic stay on Gievers' ruling until the appeals court can decide the case.

Best Care Assurance was one of four plans awarded contracts in April to serve patients in what is known as Medicaid Region 8. Molina was not one of the four plans and filed a protest. It ultimately reached a settlement in June with agency officials that included it receiving a contract in the region.

But Best Care Assurance filed the lawsuit in August, arguing that state law imposes a limit of four managed-care

plans in the region to provide "managed medical assistance" services — the services provided to most Medicaid beneficiaries. The other plans selected in April to provide such services in the region were Humana Medical Plan, Inc., Sunshine State Health Plan, Inc. and Well-Care of Florida, Inc.

Gievers, in a nine-page ruling, wrote that there is "no exception or qualification to the unquestionable statutory cap of 'no more than four' (plans) for Region 8."

"Under Florida law ... AHCA lacks the authority to ignore clear, unambiguous statutes such as the one providing the statutory cap of four contracts for Region 8," she wrote.

Florida lawmakers in 2011 approved an overhaul of the Medicaid system that has led to most beneficiaries enrolling in managed-care plans.

With an initial set of contracts poised to expire, the Agency for Health Care Administration went through a lengthy procurement process that led in April to it awarding new contracts in 11 regions of the state.

In defending the decision to award a

contract to Molina in Region 8, AHCA pointed, in part, to a section of state law aimed at encouraging managed-care plans to seek contracts in two regions of

Northwest Florida. That section allows the agency to award what are known as "bonus" contracts in other regions to managed-care plans that are awarded contracts in the Northwest Florida regions.

AHCA awarded a contract to Humana in Northwest Florida and said that Humana's contract in Southwest Florida's Region 8 is considered a "bonus" contract. AHCA attorneys contended the Humana bonus contract should not be counted toward the limit in Region 8, effectively freeing up a spot for Molina.

"AHCA's interpretation of the statute is also reasonable because it increases competition," AHCA attorneys wrote in an October filing in circuit court. "But Best Care's is not because it has the practical effect of reducing competition."

In a September filing, however, Best Care Assurance said the agency's award of the Molina contract would reduce the number of Medicaid beneficiaries and revenue going to Best Care Assurance in the managed medical assistance, or MMA, program.
